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The Summer Slide

The "summer slide" is real. What is the summer slide exactly? Studies show that when students do not read or continue to use their math facts over the summer, their academic skills can decline. To help you help your child stay sharp, we are sending home two different activity calendars: Language Calendar and Math Calendar.

Language Calendar

You can incorporate activities from the Language Calendar with your child while having fun. Each weekday there is a suggested activity to complete. There are quick language activities you can do in the car or at the dinner table.

You can read a book with your child, or your child can listen and follow along on *Learning Ally*. Your child's *Learning Ally* login information is included in this packet. Your child can read or listen along almost anywhere!

On the days that your child writes about a topic, have them write at least one or more sentences. Your child can write in their journal in the back yard or on the beach. We want them to have fun and enjoy learning this summer!

Math Calendar

The Math Calendar offers a math problem for your child to do each weekday. We have provided paper for your child to do their math problems on. The best way to keep those math facts sharp is to use them often.
